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Neriglissar $q\bar{t}pu$ of the Ebabbara – S. Zawadski Eos 74 (1986) p. 86 reads the name of the $q\bar{t}pu$ in CT 55 673 $^{\text{Id}}$ U.GUR-LUGAL- $bul^!$ -<li $t^*>$ on the basis that Nergal-šar-bullit is known as a $q\bar{t}pu$ of the Ebabbara (in Nabonidus years 1-6). However collation confirms that the copy's $^{\text{Id}}$ U.GUR-LUGAL-ŠEŠ = Nergal-šar-uṣur is correct. Accordingly, it is possible that we are dealing with a previously unattested holder of the office. The appearance of Nabû-nibšari in the text allows a date any time from Nebuchadnezzar to Nabonidus, and as there are large gaps in our knowledge of the holders of the office of $q\bar{t}pu$ in the reign of Nebuchadnezzar there is no reason to exclude the possibility of a new holder. Whether this Nergal-šar-uṣur is the same as king Neriglissar is not possible to say. A Nergal-šar-uṣur also occurs in the fragmentary piece BM 70929.

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
